- 112 Iron-Man -- a well-grounded male -- got jolted by chemically-symbolic like-composed \_\_ -male.\*
- 113 **Named after the Mexican state, this "biggest of personality, smallest of size" breed (maybe 6 lbs) is agile and obedient, a sports competitor, and among the top 10 recommended watchdogs.**
- 116 Mix Max's dry food with hot water
- 117 **This English hunting breed descended from Greyhounds is speedy, svelte, friendly. Show and competitor breed, good in apartments if given rigorous exercise, rarely barks -- even to strangers.**

- 131 **Bred on their native island as gun dogs, this friendly, "mischievous", inquisitive breed grew in popularity due to rich, mahogany coat and superb birding skills. Brushing avoids coat-napping.**
- 132 Two days after Tu.\*
- 133 **German medium-to-large, bred to herd livestock, haul butcher carts. Stout, black short-haired breed is capable at military or search-and-rescue ops. Strong, requires experienced care, training.**

- 1 Descended from large German/Polish sled dogs (mostly Spitz), the now-tiny, fluffy, foxy-faced  
breed is compact, active, and an agile competitor. Known to challenge larger dogs, real barker.

- 3 French bred for hunting hare, this short-legged scent hound only rates second in sniffing to a  
**Bloodhound. Usually bi- or tri-colored, breed is adjustable and relaxed. Prone to weight issues.**

**Exuberant hair tends to veil eyes, lends a moustache. Independent breed, requires firm care.**
- 7 **1600s Swiss/Italian canine bred to rescue lost Alp travelers at behest of hospice of same name.**  
**Reknowned Brandy packer, large, stout breed likes most everyone, drools, loves own rest space.**
- 8 Probable first syllable from an ass\*
- 9 Initials of Singer/Actor/Icon regarded as "The King of Rock-n-Roll" (1935 - 77)\*
- 10 **Either from German or French Barbet, the "elegant, proud, clever" breed is 2nd in smarts only to**  
**Border Collie, a show-winner (what with the fancy do's). Needs activity -- boredom is destructive.**
- 11 Fred's "dog"
- 12 **Also know as Alsation Wolf Dog, this largish new breed (1899) is handsome, intelligent, devote,**  
**courageous. This real worker (guide, rescue/military/police ops) is among USA's most popular.**
- 13 **19th century German guard-dog breed that sports a sleek coat, athletic build, and an aristocratic**  
**air. Energetic, smart, another worker with a graceful gait. Often ears are cropped, tail is docked.**
- 14 Initials of Aaron Neville (1941 - ), recorded 4 Platinums and 4 Top-Tens. Also recorded with Brothers.
- 15 **1300s (?) English bird dog bred to hunt Eurasian Woodcock. Beautiful, labor-intensive coat and**  
**longish ears. Breed is happiest when others are; content to snuggle, take in a flick, romp wth kids.**
- 16 Bashful
- 17 **Bred for dog-sled racing, also used for adventure treks (retirees need new homes), this athletic,**  
**hearty, double-coated group of breeds is wolfish and often pale-blue eyed. Eats a lot in winter.**
- 18 "Do not do \_\_\_ others as you would have them not do you."
- 19 **1800s (?) Croatian-bred mid-sized carriage dog, breed noted for spotted white coat, firehouses.**  
**Sleek, athletic, with stamina. As charming in life as in film -- does gallant-goofy-gallant in eyeblink.**

- 41 **Muscular with wrinkly, short-muzzled face, curled tail, a glossy tan or black short-haired coat,**  
**16th century Chinese breed later brought to Europe, popular due to Queen Victoria's fascination.**

- 44 "What de eff! *That* does it! I *mean* it: I'm *through*. Duke, tomorrow you're going to Obedience \_\_\_ !"
- 46 Initials of Indian actress Urvashi Rautela (1994 - ), crowned Miss Universe in 2015
- 48 Awaken
- 50 Resident of the city of Zagreb, inland of the Adriatic Sea (also a sheepdog breed)
- 53 Amateur should-probably-find-another-profession trainer entreats Star: "\_\_\_ please."

- 83 Hawaiian flowering evergreen tree (myrtle family)\*
- 85 Initials of 8-year Veep and 5-year POTUS (1913 - 94)\*
- 86 **1800s Newfoundland bred water dog retriever mixed with British hunters. Mid-size double-coated breed hauled nets and fetched fish escapees. Loyal, playful, a chewer (watch slippers).**
- 87 **Bred in 1830s England for hunting hare, this short-legged sharp-scent breed is used around the world to detect prohibited ag products. Intelligent, good-humored, with a lack of health issues.**
