 - 3 HOUSE: Rowena Eagle Air Blue & Bronze Grey Lady [Wit, learning, creativity, and wisdom]
 - 4 HOUSE: Salazar Serpent Water Green & Silver Bloody Baron [Cunning, leadership, and ambition]

 - 30 Initials of Omotola Ekeinde (1978 -), Nigerian actress, philanthropist, over 300 films, dubbed "Africa Magic"
 - 33 Initials of Otto Knows (1989 -), Swedish DJ, record producer, worked with Britney Spears
 - 34 Alpha-Soup for Serious Mental Illness, pertaining to adults with a diagnosable thinking disorder
 - 35 "__ all in the delivery."
 - 37 This cereal came in Wheat, Rice, or Corn

 - 41 Squeeze an "E" for Energy between these two letters, and life just got a lot more interesting!*

 - 66 HORCRUX: Riddle created this by killing Moaning Myrtle; Potter destroyed it, stabbing with a Basilisk Fang.

 107 Initials of Victor Yerrid (1971 -), puppeteer for Henson's Muppets, notably heckler Waldorf in the balcony
 109 Mark of magical significance
 111 Atlantic or Pacific white-fleshed critter, whose liver evidently is juiced with Vits A, D, E, *and* omega fatties!
